The Old Dark House (1932)

Movie & film talk available starting Friday, October 8th

Director James Whale (*Frankenstein*) invites you to a creepy family manor in this screen adaptation of the 1927 novel, *Benighted*, by J. B. Priestley. Boris Karloff's screen debut.

Rashomon (1950)

Movie & film talk available starting Friday, October 15th

Akira Kurosawa's masterpiece takes us to 12th century Japan, where a traveler interviews 4 people about a murder and gets 4 different accounts. Remade into the 1964 western, *The Outrage*.

Piranha (1978)

Movie & film talk available starting Friday, October 22nd

Director Joe Dante & producer Roger Corman's response to Spielberg's *Jaws* (1975), where an absent-minded detective and a surly backwoodsman try and locate two missing teenagers. When they accidentally set free a school of genetically altered Piranha, they realize they have bitten off more than they can chew.

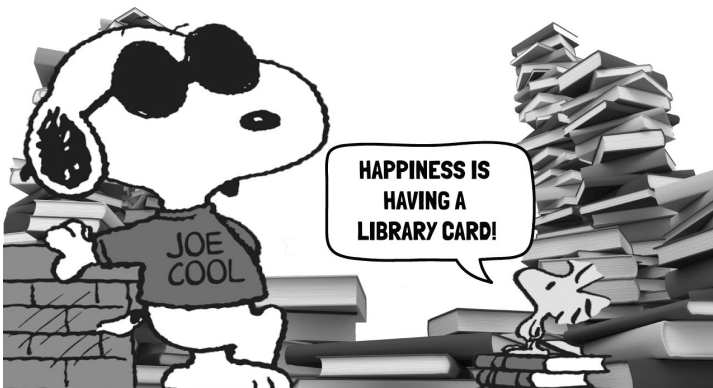

Join NASA Ambassador John Fontana to consider the possibility of alien life. Humanity is fascinated with the prospect we are not alone in the universe!



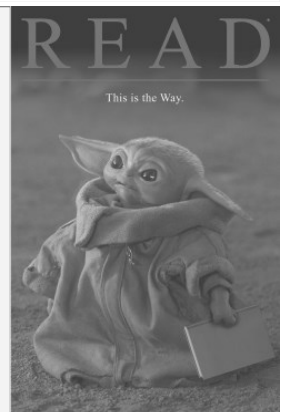
